Investment approach

- Seeks to track the performance of the FTSE Emerging Markets All Cap China A Inclusion Index.
- Passively managed, using index sampling.
- The fund invests substantially all of its assets in the stocks included in the index.

About the benchmark

- The FTSE Emerging Markets All Cap China A Inclusion Index is a market-capitalization-weighted index representing large-, mid-, and small-cap stocks of companies located in emerging markets around the world.
- The index is part of the FTSE China A Inclusion indexes, which contain FTSE China A All Cap Index securities adjusted for the aggregate approved QFII and RQFII quotas available to foreign investors.
- Brazil, Russia, India, Taiwan, China, and South Africa are among the markets included in the index.

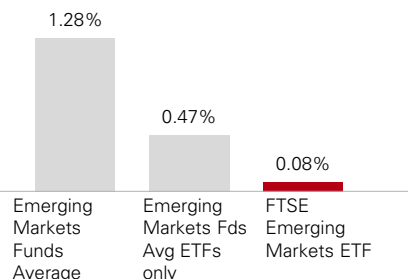
